The Rector's Corner

I would like to tell you about an upcoming event which, in my opinion, is of real importance. It is a 10 day prayer initiative called *'Thy Kingdom Come'*. Fittingly, it is scheduled from Ascension Day to the Day of Pentecost (Thursday, May 24 to Sunday, June 4). In the New Testament, we read how on the fortieth day after His Resurrection, the Lord Jesus led the apostles to the Mount of Olives and was taken up into a cloud out of their sight. But just before He ascended, He commanded "that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father". (Acts 1.4) Of this, He said, "John truly baptized with water; but you shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence". (1. 5).

So being on their own for the first time, the initial task of the apostles was to wait. And that's what they did – for ten days! The Scripture says, "These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with His brethren". (1.14) One of the hardest things to do, in the whole world, is to wait. Waiting on God requires patience and trust. How much that grates against our strong desire for control!

'Thy Kingdom Come' began last year as an invitation from the Archbishop of Canterbury (Justin Welby) and the Archbishop of York (John Sentamu) to the Church of England; and, more than 100,000 people participated. In his message for this year's event, Archbishop Justin Welby says: "Jesus prayed at the Last Supper that we, those who follow Him, might 'be one that the world might believe'. We are invited to make a lasting difference in our nations and in our world, by responding to his call to find a deep unity of purpose in prayer." He goes on to say that people can pray in whatever way they choose, wherever they are. "It's not a Church of England thing, it's not an Anglican thing, it's a Christian thing."

(The following two paragraphs are reprinted from the Anglican Journal.) Emma Buchan, project leader for the Archbishop's Evangelism Taskforce, who heads up *'Thy Kingdom Come'*, says: "The global response to the campaign this year has been overwhelming. We've heard from churches across the world, including different denominations and traditions, who are all pledging to get involved from South Africa to Canada and from the Brazil to Hong Kong. Each place is organising the time in their own way. For example, in Hong Kong

they are planning big celebrations in the cathedrals and establishing a network of 'prayer warriors'. ...

"We're hoping people will take part and be catalysts for setting up prayer events in their local area. Last year *'Thy Kingdom Come'* gave people time and space...to come closer to God and we heard many stories of the deep impact it had on people's lives. Our new website has a wide range of resources for everyone which includes ideas on prayer stations, prayer walks, finding fun and creative ways of praying together as a family. We also have Novena prayer booklets and liturgy for a range of traditions."

Ten days of prayer during Ascensiontide are certainly timely; and "praying for more people to know Jesus Christ" is exactly what we should be doing. South Sudan:

On March 23, 2017, ACT Alliance a partner of the (Anglican Church of Canada's) Primate's World Relief and Development Fund, issued a South Sudan Famine Crisis Response with a target of raising US \$9 million for one year. **PWRDF contributed an initial grant of \$25,000.** ACT South partners are on the ground to help meet basic needs of 180,000 South Sudanese refugees and IDPS, such as:

- food security (food, vouchers or cash for work, tools, fishing kits and training);
- nutrition (supplements for children under five and pregnant and lactating women, as well as nutrition education);
- water (repairing existing water points and drilling new ones, revitalizing water management committees);
- hygiene (WASH facilities, hygiene kits, training hygiene promoters/health workers);
- education (school supplies and school meals);
- psychosocial support.
