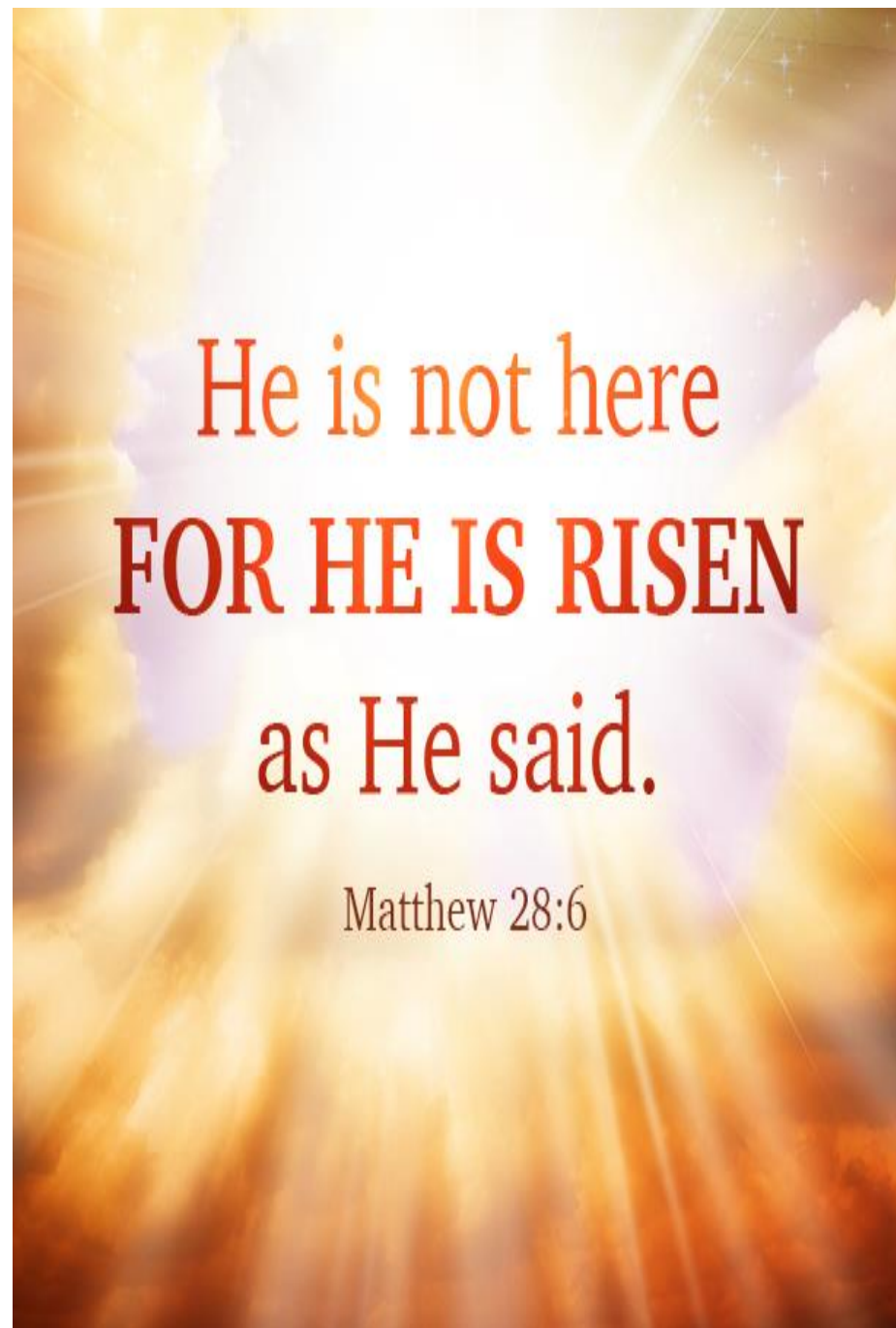

Lesson: Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in His great mercy gave us a new birth into a living hope by the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead! The inheritance to which we are born is one that nothing can destroy or spoil or wither. It is kept for you in heaven, and you, because you put your faith in God, are under the protection of His power until salvation comes- the salvation which is even now in readiness and will be revealed at the end of time. (1 Peter 1: vs. 3-5)

Let us pray

All-powerful and ever living God, grant to us thy servants that we may with pure hearts and minds enter into the mysteries of the Paschal Feast; and, being risen with Christ, may rejoice in the glory of them that are born again. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Station at the Rood Screen

V / To this end Christ died and rose again;

R / That He might be the Lord of the dead and the living.

Lesson: This perishable being must be clothed with the imperishable, and what is mortal must be clothed with immortality. And when our mortality has been clothed with immortality, then the saying of Scripture will come true: “Death is swallowed up; victory is won!” (1 Corinthians XV vs. 53-55)

Let us pray

O God who for our redemption didst give thine only-begotten Son to the death of the Cross, and by His glorious Resurrection has delivered us from the power of our enemy: Grant us so to die daily unto sin, that we may evermore live with Him in the joy of His Resurrection. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Rector's Corner

"Have you seen Him Whom my soul loves?" (Song of Songs 3:3b)

"But Mary [Magdalene] stood outside the tomb weeping, and as she wept she stooped down and looked into the tomb. And she saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain." (John 20:11-12)

Take a look now, if you would, at the Altar. Do you see the empty tomb? Do you see the white linen cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' body, but now He is nowhere to be seen? Do you see the white handkerchief, neatly folded together, the very piece that had been around His wounded, sacred head, pierced with a crown of thorns? Do you see the two white candles, one at the head and one at the feet, where the body of Jesus would have been? Then you see what Mary Magdalene saw when she stooped down and looked into the tomb, her heart torn with grief, searching for her Beloved.

"There I will make Myself known to you, and I will speak with you from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim which are on the ark of testimony..." (Exodus 25:22)

When we look towards the Altar, we should do so with true expectation of finding His Presence there, because God does not make promises in vain. Just as He was present above the Mercy Seat between the two Cherubim, He will make Himself known to everyone who approaches His Presence with faith in their heart.

God the Father replaced the Ark of Testimony, or the Ark of the Covenant, with the resurrection bed of His Son, Jesus Christ. In one holy act of perfect, sacrificial Love, God replaced the three items hidden within the Ark — the two stone tablets of the Ten Commandments (the Law), Aaron's rod that budded (the Levitical priesthood), and the manna collected in the Sinai desert (physical sustenance from God) — with His Beloved Son, in Whom He was well pleased.

"Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill." (Matthew 5:17)

"And having been perfected, He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him, called by God as High Priest 'according to the order of Melchizedek...' (Hebrews 5:9-10)

"This is the bread which came down from heaven — not as your fathers ate the manna and are dead. He who eats this bread will live forever." (John 6:58)

Jesus Christ fulfilled the Law, became the High Priest forever, and has offered His Body, the true, life-giving manna, as the perfect sacrifice and atonement for all sins.

Let us kneel then at the Tomb that has become His Throne, His victory over death. Let us pray with thanksgiving and the abounding love of St. Mary Magdalene in our hearts. And let us never forget that the greatest miracle our Lord left us to preserve until the end times happens on the Altar every Sunday: the Mystery of the Eucharist, when we celebrate His Resurrection. Let us walk through Holy Communion like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus:

"Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight. And they said to one another, 'Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the Scriptures to us?' (Luke 24:30-32)

Beholding that mystical Presence of our God in the true manna sent to us from above, which truth is revealed in Holy Scripture, let us eat the Body and drink the Blood of the New Covenant, and let us commune with our God as intimately as a lover with her Beloved as He reveals Himself to us and transforms our hearts into His likeness. So let us lift up our hearts and shout together with the entire Body of Christ in the world and the whole company of Heaven in perpetual adoration:

He is Risen!
