The Rector's Corner

On a bright sunny morning on July 8th, 4 leaders and 11 Scouts gathered on the front steps of St. George's Church to receive a blessing from Fr. Chris (something he had done many times before on numerous trips the Scouts had gone on) as they were ready to depart for their week-long adventure to the Canadian Jamboree being held in Nova Scotia at Camp Nedooae.

The drive down was sunny, but increasing cloud cover signaled what kind of weather Nova Scotia had experienced the night before, rain...and lots of it. We knew the sites we would be camping in had been clear cut and the stumps removed just last fall, and seeded for grass just three weeks before the event, so we knew what to expect...mud!

We arrived at the Fairgrounds where we were to park our vehicles and unload our gear before being transported to the actual site at 1:30pm. We waited for 3 hours before being dropped off in the parking lot of Camp Nedooae, and once there waited another 3 hours to be brought to our site, once there we raked all the rocks and branches off the ground and laid tarps down to set our tents and cook shelter on (be prepared!). We finally had supper at 10pm.

The rest of the week was spent walking (and lots of it) to the different project where we learned about our Mi'gmaq, Scottish and Acadians cultures, did obstacle courses, horseback riding, toured historic Halifax, did a mud race (we were already dirty so why not!), did a Tree Go adventure, waiting in line to use the porta potties and trying to find showers that had water (that's another story for another time) and many more things.

But the best part of the Jamboree was meeting some of the 6500 Scouts and Leaders from every province and territory in Canada. We had a group from Victoria BC next to us and a group from Dublin Ireland. We met Leaders from Scotland and we even had a contingent from Thailand. We exchanged badges and crest, and stories about what we each do in Scouting in our own areas, walking away with memories and new friendships.

The days started early and ended late, but after two years of fundraising all the hard work was finally being paid off, as we watched our youth truly enjoying themselves, making new friends, and seeing the passion for Scouting being renewed in their hearts, something that wouldn't be possible without the dedicated team of Leaders and the support we receive from St. George's Church.

Registration Night for Scouting will take place on Wednesday, **September 6th at 6:30 pm**. Scouts will meet on Mondays at 7:00 pm, Beavers, Tuesdays at 6:30 pm and Cubs on Wednesday at 6:30 pm.
