

Rector's Corner

Rector's Corner Trinity XIV

Last week, we were introduced to the Life and Witness of Richard Rolle. In today's instalment of the Rector's corner, we will look at a couple of fundamental principles of the Spiritual Life that we as 21st century Christians can use to our Soul's health.

In his "The Form of Perfect Living" Rolle begins by outlining the problem that each of us have in following a consistently Christian life. He reminds us that we are to a greater or lesser degree weighed down by the "Default of ghostly strength" in other words; we find that our hearts are too weak to stand against the temptations of the devil. He remarks that because of this inner weakness, we are not able of ourselves to "lift our wills to yearn for the love of God". The second great hindrance to spiritual union of our hearts to God is the misuse of fleshly desires. He does not teach us that these inner desires are evil, but that they must be seen for what they are and reordered according to the Divine pattern. Thirdly, he laments that we so often "exchange a lasting good for a passing delight" I think that each of us can see the danger in this shortsighted attitude. The Christian is engaged in a campaign of spiritual warfare that began at our Baptism, when we received the sign of the Holy Cross. All of us are called to "fight manfully" under this sign against all that is unlike Him who is our Victorious Lord. So for Richard Rolle, the whole of his advise and counsel is aimed towards equipping you and I for this struggle.

Rolle continues in his book to point to those things that can serve to undermine our good intentions. He warns against a certain attitude of "softness of life" and overindulgence in the outward things of life that can be the means of our downfall. At the same time he reminds us that an overzealous approach to this reordering of our inner man can become a snare in itself. He recommends rather an inner watchfulness over the thoughts and intentions of our hearts, lest Satan twist these heavenly virtues and attitudes so that they become destructive to the growth and maturing of our souls in Christ. The second and perhaps most important introductory point that Rolle discusses is the necessity for the soul to abide in patience and trust. Spiritual growth is not achieved in a moment, but is the work of many years. There is the need for a continual turning from self, with all its corruption and weakness, to the ever present source of

sweetness and life. The author puts it this way "No man to such revelation and grace on the first day may come; but through long travel and carefulness to love Jesus Christ, as thou shall here-afterward" Here then in this book of spiritual advises, we have the groundwork laid out for us-not an easy road, but the way of the pilgrim, whether solitary ,or living very much in the midst of our culture. Next week we will think of some of the specific practices that can aid us in this blessed tending of the life of the soul, as discovered by Rolle in his little work on the "Form of Perfect Living". Let's think of these important things often, and especially as we pray "...cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name..."

You know my sitting down and my rising up
You understand my thought afar off
You comprehend my path and my lying down
And are acquainted with all my ways. Psalm 139:1-3*
