The Rector's Corner

I am writing to you today to let people know about a new Rooftop Garden that was created this summer at the Moncton Hospital. The grand opening was held August 14th and I was lucky enough to speak at this event as a former in-patient in the adult psychiatry unit on the third floor. Four years ago I was in the hospital for two and a half months, suffering with an eating disorder and depression due to my brother passing away! Because of what I was being treated for, I wasn't allowed access to going outside on my own, so I would dream about a place I could go just outside the unit, where I could get some fresh air and sunshine. I even brought a sun lamp in my room to try to get some much-needed sunlight and would sit for hours in front of any window I could find. Not long after getting out of the hospital, I joined a group called the Recovery Warriors. These are people with lived experience like myself and various health care professionals that meet to make changes in the existing health care facilities including Mental Health on Albert St., the Detox Centre on Mapleton Rd. as well as the child and adult psychiatry units at the Moncton Hospital. With the help of this group, so many changes were made for the better and this is where the idea of the Rooftop Garden was formed.

The Friends of the Moncton Hospital raised \$230,000.00 to build the Garden and MacArthurs's Nursery donated all the plants, earth and planting time. It is a very beautiful, peaceful place that is now being used by the patients in the child and adult psychiatry units and the children's ward. They even have a large basketball net there and solar lights throughout the garden which make it very inviting at night too! I know so many people will benefit from this place and I feel it is an important step toward wellness! Maybe it will even cut down on the amount of medications the patients will have to take.

My name is Susan Duquette and I am proud to say that I am healed and well! I sing in the choir here at St. George's which gives me a lot of joy! It is very healing to belong to a group of such nice people, and singing always lifts my spirits. Coming back to St. George's after my illness has strengthened my faith in a power much greater than myself, and I am truly grateful!

This is a different, because the focus is on the community and for the longer term. It is about a '**hand up**' rather than a '**hand out**'. Information on a proposed World Vision goal for us will be ready next week. That said, the Operation Christmas Child materials will be available at the Church Office for those who wish to continue with that project.
