# THE RECTOR'S CORNER

## REMEMBRANCE DAY 2020

“It is my earnest hope, and indeed the hope of all mankind, that from this solemn occasion a better world shall emerge out of the blood and carnage of the past — a world founded upon faith and understanding, a world dedicated to the dignity of man and the fulfillment of his most cherished wish for freedom, tolerance, and justice.” (General Douglas MacArthur, September 2, 1945)

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II in Europe, a war involving countries from around the world. For Canada and Europe, the war started in the fall of 1939. In Africa and Asia, the start dates were earlier, although the United States did not join the war until after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor in December 1941. In 1945, as the Soviet Red Army approached Germany from the west while Canada and the other Allied armies approached from the east, the Nazi forces knew they faced certain defeat. Adolf Hitler committed suicide on April 30, 1945, and the War in Europe ended on May 8, 1945. The war in Asia continued until August 15, 1945. Over a million Canadians (including Newfoundlanders) served in the war effort, and almost 45,000 died. In total, the War took the lives of up to 50 million people. They died in the fight for freedom, democracy, and equality and to end tyranny and oppression.

Today, our few remaining Canadian veterans remember the war with sharp clarity; just as the many Canadians who stayed on the home front remember how they helped the war effort. We must never forget what they sacrificed for us. We owe them all an enormous debt of gratitude. Covid-19 will cause us to reflect upon their sacrifice in a more private fashion as most of us will not be able to attend Remembrance Day ceremonies due to health protocols. We should however buy a poppy (remembering that these donations support many Legion programs for veterans and their families), take the time to watch a ceremony on TV or livestream and pay our respects to the brave veterans. Our task is to remember the sacrifices of those who served, and to better understand the history and conditions that gave rise to war. On this solemn occasion, let us honour our veterans, especially those who lost their lives in the Second World War, while making every effort to prevent further aggression and intolerance.

Unfortunately, many in our secular world have forgotten the meaning of freedom and democracy. As Christians, it is our duty to remember the sacrifices of our forefathers, ensure that our younger generation

understands the causes and horrors of war and why we had them while allowing them to become responsible citizens. We need people who are proud of their country and properly exercise their democratic rights in a peaceful manner.

“A freedom that only asks what’s in it for me,  
A freedom without commitment to others,  
A freedom without love or charity or duty or patriotism,  
Is unworthy of our founding ideals, and those who died in their defense.” (Barack Obama, April 6, 2014)

On this Remembrance Sunday, let us pray, with thankful hearts, for all those who have died in combat, brave individuals who perished in battle. Let us also remember those who came home with physical and psychological injuries and their loved ones.
