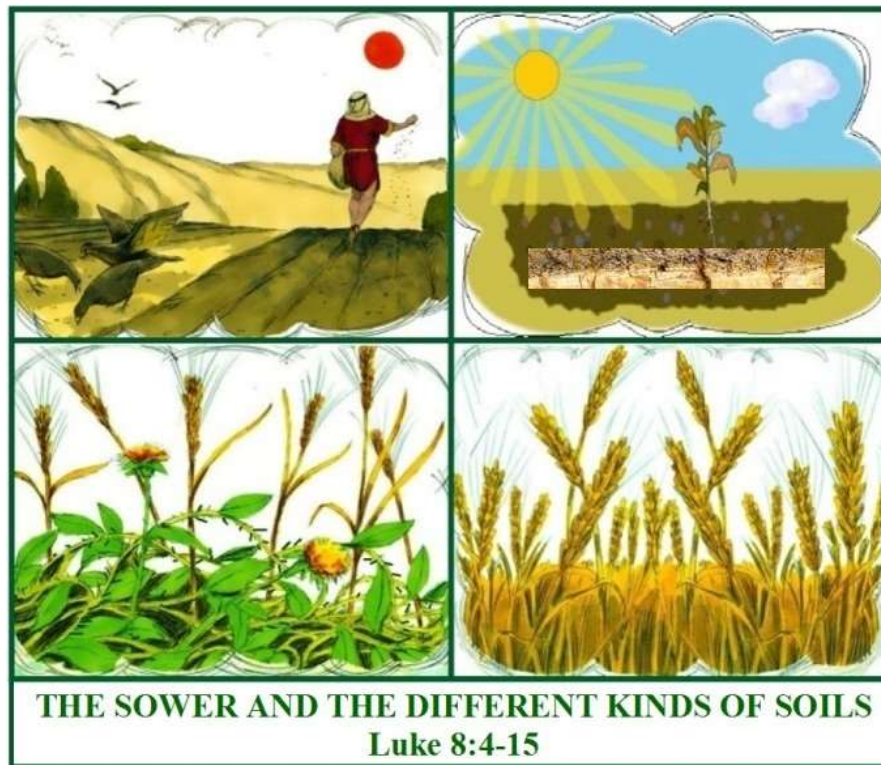

those in chemotherapy;
those on radiation;
the immobile; the forgetful
and the forgotten; the
hungry and thirsty; the
stranger and the naked;

those up to their ears in debt;
the superstitious; the paranoid;
the falsely led and hard-hearted;
worriers and pretenders; and
catastrophic thinkers. All of us --
mere humans – young and old
Miserable sinners like me.
