The Rector's Corner

Now that we have begun our Lenten journey, we will be thinking about the wonderful gift that our Blessed Lord has given us in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. For us as Christian men and women, this great pledge of the Father's love stands at the very centre of our spiritual lives. Here is a gift coming to us straight from the Father's heart of love-here is a pledge to us of His goodwill and grace.

The Holy Communion is a great mystery of love and so it is important for each of us to deepen our understanding of it, and also to discover how we might approach it with greater reverence and anticipation.

The Prayerbook describes the Eucharist in a number of different ways. This helps us to grasp in some small way the tremendous graces that the Lord has placed in this Sacrament. In the Catechism on pg.552 of the Prayerbook, we learn that this Sacrament was given to strengthen and refresh us both in soul and body-not only for this earthly life, but to prepare us for eternal life as well. Every one of us needs this Blessed refreshing that comes from the Heart of our Lord, and it is ours in the Holy Communion as often as we approach the Altar of God.

Life can be difficult and almost overwhelming for all of us at times. We all face times when we feel dry and lifeless, when everything seems confused and we don't know where to go or what to do! This is when the Sacrament of our Lord's Body and Blood can bring such peace and refreshment. In the Holy Communion we receive the refreshing of soul and body that gives peace to the broken heart and the troubled mind.

Next week we will look at another aspect of the Holy Communion, but for now may we all seek to be refreshed, renewed, and remade in His Blessed Image through this Most Holy Sacrament!

Highlights of 2020 Annual General Meeting - February 21, 2021

- The financial accounts and statements were reviewed by Phil Haylock, Marilyn Hayre, Noel Eustace and Allen Urquhart and certified to accurately represent the Year End Financial Statements as well as the financial transactions of the Parish. The cash and investments balances properly state the financial position of the Parish.
- The investment fund has a balance of \$512,641; the value of the building and equipment is \$1,377,831 and the Memorial Fund balance is \$217,496.
- The General Operating Fund for 2020 shows revenue of \$261,440 and expenditures of \$271,443 with a deficit of \$10,003.
- The proposed budget for 2021 was presented and approved with a projected revenue of \$251,600 while expenditures are projected at \$260,562 with a projected deficit of \$8962.
- The 2021 Wardens are: Sheila Searle and Kelly VanBuskirk.
- The 2021 Vestry Members are: Linus Coady, Marilyn Crossman-Riel, Dianne Dallaire, Marthe Gradon, Marilyn Hayre, David Jessop, Tyler McKenna, Clifford Reid, Marilyn Rice, Peter Stam, and Allen Urquhart.
- Synod Delegates are Ann Balch, Olivia Lipton, Bill Ross, Martin Stam, Nick Stam, and Kelly VanBuskirk. Two (2) adult delegates and one (1) Youth delegate will attend.
- Bill Ross serves on the Diocesan Council. He updated those present on the Diocesan project to provide the Diocese of Ho with a mobile medical clinic. Private parishioner donations are being sought to raise the remaining \$20,000 required to complete the project.
- AGM attendees wished to convey their recognition of the excellent service given to the parish by Judy Kendall as Envelope Secretary and Vestry Member.
- Archdeacon Ham spoke on the influence our Parish has had in the Diocese during the pandemic.
