The Rector's Corner



'Breathe on me, Breath of God' is a little hymn which many of us have sung since we were children. Here is the back-story. It was written in 1876 by Edwin Hatch a Priest in the Church of England. At the time, he was 42 years old and serving as Vice-Principal of St. Mary's Hall in Oxford. He did not grow up in the Anglican Church, but joined when he was 18 years old through the influences of his friends and one of his teachers.

He sensed a call to be ordained, and was made a Deacon in 1858 and a Priest in 1859. Three years later he came to Trinity College in Toronto and lectured as a professor of Classics. His new office forced him to study classical literature and the writings of the Greek philosophers closely. During this time, he began to draw conclusions about the origins of the episcopacy (the Office of a Bishop) that challenged the teaching of the Bible and the practice of the Church. In 1862, he moved to Quebec City and served as the Rector of the high school of Quebec and Professor of Classics at Morrin College. While in Canada, hatch and his wife, Evelyn had two children: Arthur and Beatrice. After returning to England in 1867, they were blessed with two more: Ethel and Evelyn.

Edwin Hatch passed through some early struggles in his life which apparently contributed to his "strong mental independence". He was also known for his "extreme study habits". Given those characteristics, along with his focus on the Greek philosophers, it is interesting -- if not surprising -- that he wrote "Breathe on Me, Breath of God".

As one commentator says, "The text is a prayer for renewal by God's Spirit (like Ps. 51:10-12), a renewal that is to be expressed in a life of love, in purity of heart and will, and in an intimacy with God that heralds the perfection of eternal life. In both Hebrew and Greek the Word for "spirit" is the same as "wind/air/breath"; thus in this text the Spirit of God is referred to as "Breath of God." The lyrics seem amazingly simple and sensitive for a man who was so intensely educated and driven. The gentle tune swells and falls gracefully, almost like it is breathing itself. As the first two stanzas express, this hymn encapsulates a deep desire to be renewed in Christ, and purified by the Holy Spirit" (from Hymnary. Org):

Breathe on me, Breath of God/ Fill me with life anew/ That I may love what Thou dost love/ And do what Thou wouldst do.

Breathe on me, Breath of God/ Until my heart is pure/ Until my will is one with thine/ To do and to endure.

Today, we remember how the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost was accompanied with a rushing, mighty wind and with tongues of fire. With Edwin Hatch, let us pray for this same Almighty and Eternal Breath to fill us and renew us that we may love God and glorify His holy Name.
