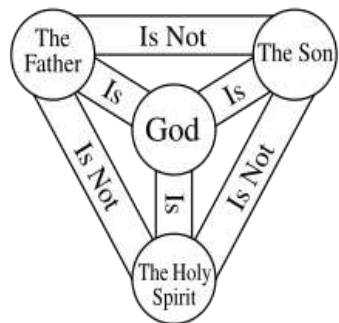

## The Rector's Corner



Today is Trinity Sunday, and, as is the Church's custom, we will use the Creed of St. Athanasius (page 695) instead of the Nicene Creed to confess our faith. The sub-title, '*Quicumque Vult*', is the Latin for the first two words of the creed: "*Whosoever would*".

The Creed of St. Athanasius has two sections, one dealing with the Holy Trinity and the other with the Incarnation; and it begins and ends with warnings about the necessity of "holding fast to the Catholic Faith". The word 'catholic' in this sense refers to the whole Church: the historic doctrine and practice of the universal Church as rooted in the Bible.

The Athanasian Creed has been used by Christian churches since the sixth century. It is the first creed in which the equality of the three persons of the Trinity is explicitly stated. The exactness of the wording may seem over-done to some, but it was designed to guard against the heresy of Arianism which insisted that the Son of God is not co-eternal with God the Father and is therefore subordinate to Him. (The result of that belief, of course, means that Jesus' death on the Cross was ineffective in taking away the sins of the world.)

To help people understand the Creed of St. Athanasius, the 'Shield of Faith' sketch became popular in the Middle Ages. Pictured above, it was a helpful aid in translating theological language into simple logic, through a visual diagram. It appeared in English and French books, stained-glass windows and ornamental Church carvings.

The Christian belief that God is Three Persons in One is not an invention of the Church. Rather, it is something revealed by God in His Word. For example, we get a glimpse of the Holy Trinity in the account of Jesus' Baptism:

*"In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And when He came up out of the water, immediately He saw the heavens being torn open and the*

*Spirit descending on Him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.' (St. Mark 1.9)*

We cannot understand this holy Mystery – that the living and eternal God is a Unity of Three Persons. We can, however, trust and adore Him, by faith. And, the idea of Unity – and the perfect Love of that Divine Unity -- can speak to us. God is love, and His holy Love is the source of all life, and everlasting life. In His Love, God came to us in the Person of His Son, Jesus Christ. He died and rose again so that we may dwell with God forever.
