For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost, and these three are one. And there are three that bear witness in earth, the spirit and the water and the blood: and these three agree in one." 1 John .5, 6, 7, 8

The Rector's Corner

In the 1563, the Church of England published the Thirty-Nine Articles in an effort to provide its people with some guidance on the essentials of the Christian Faith. The first of these Articles is entitled, 'Of Faith in the Holy Trinity' and it says:

"There is but one, living and true God, everlasting, without body, parts, or passions;

Of infinite power, wisdom, and goodness; the Maker, and Preserver of all things both visible and invisible. And in unity of this Godhead there be three Persons, of one substance, power, and eternity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost." (page 699, BCP)

Let's take a few minutes to look at this statement – or at least a little bit of it! To say that God is "everlasting" means that God is not restricted to the limitations of time and space, like us. As one commentator wrote, "(By saying this) we affirm that time and space impose no limitations upon His knowledge and activity as they do upon ours....There was no moment of time when He first came into being. With us, time is associated with change and decay. But God never grows old or weary (Isaiah 40.28). Time does not hamper His knowledge or His power as it does our own. In some sense the future is as present to Him as the past. He lives 'in an eternal present' – 'one day is to the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day". (2 Peter 3.8) Because He is eternal, He is "*the only wise God*" (Romans 16.27)

To say that God is "with body" means that He does not have physical needs and appetites like us. He does not need to be fed. He does not need to sleep, or shower, or brush His teeth. He does not need to worry about clothing. As St. John wrote, "God is Spirit". (4.24); and therefore, "He can act always and everywhere; and nothing is hidden from His sight or His control". And so Psalm 139 says, "Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in hell, you are there! If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me." To say that God is "without parts" means that He is unable to be divided. Here the commentator makes some really helpful points:

First: "If God does not occupy space He is indivisible, since division implies space.

Second: God is not distracted by competing interests or desires; and He is not susceptible to memory lapses. So, He can deal with everything at once without being conflicted. His attention is not divided.

Finally, to say that God is "without passions" means that "God's purpose and character are ever one and the same". Even as He deals with us, and all of our inconsistencies, His purpose is always to unite His creatures and creation to Himself. His actions are never random as He works out His will in this world.

The Article finishes by saying that within "this Godhead there be three Persons, of one substance, power, and eternity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost". That is how God has revealed Himself to us in His Word. He is the almighty and everlasting Spirit; and yet, in love, He came down from Heaven and became human, being born of the Virgin Mary. Through Jesus Christ, the eternal Son, God understands us in every way, and wants to dwell in each one of us by His Spirit.

May 2022 Vestry Meeting Briefs

- The Finance Committee reported that revenue from January 1 to May 31, 2022, was \$91,175 with expenses totalling \$98,389.
- The Group Committee reported that the Scouts, Cubs and Beavers have been active. They have been working on Heavenly Greens and other activities. There is a need for a new Treasurer for the Group Committee.
- The Building Committee reported that Richard Evers is working on the Bell Tower. A ventilation fan will be installed in the shower washroom and the City of Moncton has contributed \$1600 toward the cost. Necessary repairs to the Rectory were approved.
- The church hall will be closed from July 1st to July 10th to allow for the floor to washed, stripped, and waxed. The Provincial Government is paying for this work.
- The Community Outreach Committee informed Vestry that 1,140 meals were served during May and that 17 volunteers attended the training session.
- Vestry has requested a meeting with the Archbishop to discuss and clarify some details concerning a new deacon-to-be in the Parish on a three-year succession plan.
- Vestry reviewed the objectives agreed to from the Visioning Day. Vestry members will form committees to work on each objective over the next five years. More info to come.
- Vestry was informed about clergy meetings to discuss the Future Ministry of the Moncton Parishes. Their last meeting (last week) included the Wardens & Treasurers from each parish. The clergy has committed to working together and are planning shared events for the Fall.
- The next Vestry Meeting will be held on Monday September 12, 2022.
