

The Rector's Corner

The events in the Middle East have us all with one eye on the television and one ear on the radio. Israel's response to Hamas is one thing, but the possibility of Hezbollah's involvement brings a whole other dimension to the situation with its 100,000 troops and precision-guided missiles. In less than two weeks, the world has moved to the edge of a complicated, multi-front conflict involving Israel, Iran, Lebanon, Palestine and the United States – and only the Lord Himself knows the other state actors who are behind the scenes.

The graphic, on-site news reports are powerful, and sometimes it feels like we have been transported from our peaceful, comfortable homes to the dusty Gaza border. But, as much as the potential for a full-scale war in the Middle East is unsettling – even terrifying – we must try to keep a perspective of faith. The perspective which is opened by trusting in the Lord, and in His Second Coming as our King and Saviour.

For example, He has told us in His Word of the signs that will precede His return:

"You are bound to hear of revolutions and rumours of wars; watch out and do not be disturbed; for all of these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; and there will be famines and plagues and earthquakes in different places. But all these things are just the beginning of travail." (St. Matthew 24. 6-8)

As Christians – followers of the Lord Jesus Christ – we believe that "He shall come again with glory to judge both the quick (the living) and the dead"; and, that "His kingdom will have no end." The Lord's Prayer teaches us the same: "For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever".

Still, our fallen nature tends to doubt Him. But look around at the brilliant Fall colours, and "consider the lilies". Reflect upon the miracle of a baby's conception, birth and development. Amidst all the world's hatred, stop and think of the transforming power of love. As the children of God, we believe that the suffering and destruction of war will one day be replaced with Peace — a Peace which the

world can never give. We await another kingdom, one that belongs to God.

The Living God Who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit is faithful and He will do what He has promised: Christ shall come again, and every eye will see Him, those of Hamas or Hezbollah and the eyes of all the peoples in Israel, Palestine, Iran or Lebanon. Then, "He will send His angels with a large trumpet, and they will gather His chosen ones from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other". (St. Matthew 24. 31)

So, let us stand firm in this heavenly perspective – in what is eternal and true. As Jesus said, "Do not be afraid, O little flock; for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom". (St. Luke 12.32)

October 2023 Vestry Briefs

- The Finance Committee reported that revenue from January 1 to September 30, 2023 was \$ 170,118 with expenses totalling \$209,382.
- The Group Committee reported that the Beavers (Monday) and Cubs and Scouts (Wednesday) are active. There are 5 participants in each group. They held an overnight camp in September and are preparing to participate at the Victoria Park Remembrance Day Ceremony.
- Community Outreach continues to serve an average of 100 daily breakfasts as well as maintaining laundry, showers, and clothing services. The Outreach Program is well funded and is not a burden on church finances.
- In support of Community Outreach, many grants were applied for and most have been successful. Our diocese has been very generous in supporting our mission.
- Vestry received an appraisal on the Rectory by a licensed appraiser. After discussion, Vestry approved selling the Rectory pending some legal & financial clarifications from the Diocese.
- While looking for a suitable new rectory, Vestry approved paying the rent and utilities for the Rector's apartment effective Jan 1st, 2024.
- The next Vestry Meeting will be held on Monday November 13, 2023.
