

Rector's Corner

This will be the last of my reflections on the Arctic.

During the first week of our 'sail' I found myself almost mesmerized by the vastness of the sea. Even the trip from Halifax to St. John's left me amazed by the immensity of the water. But once we left St. John's, the Labrador Sea introduced me to another level: we travelled days without seeing land. And so it was in the Davis Strait and through the North West Passage, and up the coast of Greenland. I remembered that line from Coleridge's 'Rime of the Ancient Mariner':

"Water, water, everywhere, And all the boards did shrink; Water, water, everywhere, Nor any drop to drink."

But, of course, long, long before Coleridge there is God's mysterious Word from the beginning:

"God created the heavens and the earth in the very beginning. And the earth was without form and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the water....And God said, 'Let the waters that are under the sky be gathered together in one place, and let the dry land appear; and it was so. And God called the dry land Earth; and the gathering together of the waters He called Seas; and God saw that it was good." (Genesis 1. 1-2, 9-10)

St. Basil, Bishop of Caesarea in the fourth century, reflected upon the six days of Creation in his Hexaemeron – particularly the idea of the waters under the sky being gathered together into Seas. For example, he wrote:

"It was ordered that it should be the natural property of water to flow... Some flow of their own accord like springs and rivers, others are collected and stationary...Waters flow in virtue of God's order, and the sea is enclosed in limits according to this first law, 'Let the waters be gathered together unto one place.' For fear the water should spread beyond its bed, and in its successive invasions cover one by one all countries, and end by flooding the whole earth, it received the order to gather unto one place. Thus we often see the furious sea raising mighty waves to the heaven, and, when once it has touched the shore, break its impetuosity in foam and retire."

I find it helpful to have the verses from Genesis broken down in this way by thinking about water 'flowing' and 'gathering'. By slowing down to consider these things, we are reminded of this fact presented by St. Basil: "To say that the waters were gathered in one place indicates that previously they were scattered in many places. The mountains, intersected by deep

ravines, accumulated water in their valleys, when from every direction the waters betook themselves to the one gathering place."

Near the end of the Book of Job, God asks Job: "Have you entered into the depths of the sea? Or have you walked in the foundations of the deep?" (38.16)

It is a humbling question that reveals our smallness. And that's how I felt standing on the quarterdeck of the HMCS Harry DeWolf, watching the trail of foam disappear behinds us. How very small we are – how utterly dependent upon the Lord. In Job's words:

"Who am I to think that I can give counsel without knowledge? You have declared to me that I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me which I did not know." (42.3)

And so unto God Almighty: the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost – the only wise God -- be ascribed all majesty, dominion, power, honour and glory forever and ever. Amen

November 2022 Vestry Meeting Briefs

• The Finance Committee reported that revenue from January 1 to October 31, 2023, was \$193,350 with expenses totalling \$228,088. The deficit is now -\$34,738.

• The Cubs, Beavers and Scouts continue to be busy, one of the activities is learning how to use a compass. The annual dessert party has been moved to Spring/early summer.

• The Property Committee reported that the repairs on the chapel steps will be done in the spring when the weather is better for concrete. However, the loose railing will be repaired soon. The Committee will also investigate better lighting for outdoors using LED lights.

• The sale of the Rectory is moving forward, pending approval of the Diocesan Property Committee as well as the Finance Committee.

• Grants have been received from Mazon and St. Martin's in the Woods for Community Meals.

• There will be a volunteer training session on Nov 29, 2023, focusing on de-escalation and trauma care.

• The Annual general meeting of the parish will be held on Sunday February 11th, 2024, following the 10am service. The snow date is Monday February 12th, 2024, at 7pm.

• With amalgamation on the horizon, finances were discussed at length with two budgets, one for the new parish and the second for the maintenance of St. George's Church as each church is responsible for the upkeep of their buildings. As well, there was discussion on the need/election of 2 wardens for the new parish and a church committee to oversee the upkeep of St. George's.

• With Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday, the church will be decorated on Sunday December 17th following the 10am service.

• The next Vestry Meeting will be held at 7pm on Monday December 11, 2023
